

Privacy Policy

We, Worcester Funeral Service Limited, are committed to protecting the privacy of anyone using our site and the confidentiality of any information that you provide us with. The purpose of this statement is to set out how we use any personal information that we may obtain from you via our website.

Use and Collection of Personal Information

In general you can visit our website without telling us who you are and without revealing any information about yourself.

However, there are areas of our website where we do gather data as follows:

- If you submit an enquiry via our website you will be asked to provide certain information, including name, e-mail address and contact number.
- We will store this data and hold it via our externally hosted server and some secure third party websites.

We may use information that you provide:

- To deal with your enquiry which may include contacting you directly and supplying quotations and further information about our services
- We use your data to inform the crematorium, church, cemetery and minister or celebrant of details of the deceased, funeral service and next of kin details for contact purposes.
- Your details are only used for the purposes of the funeral arrangements along with any further arrangements regarding the cremated remains.
- The details are then filed away securely in our archives for the future in case of exhumation of the deceased or cremated remains for any reason.
- Family may also need information from the arrangements at a later date to arrange another family funeral.
- We will also give your details to your chosen charity to confirm receipt of the donations directly.
- We will confirm the applicants name to the DWP if approached by them on your behalf.
- We do not use your data for any marketing or sell your information to a third party.

Cookies

We collect information directly from you in a number of ways. One way is through our use of “cookies”. Most websites use cookies in order to make them work, or to work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the website. They help us to understand how our customers and potential customers use our website so we can develop and improve the design, layout, content and function of the site. Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer’s hard drive by websites that you visit. They save and retrieve pieces of information about your visit to the website – for example, how you entered the site, how you

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navigated through the site and what information and documentation was of interest to you. This means that when you go back to a website, it can give you tailored options based on the information it has stored about you on your last visit.

We use cookies generated by WordPress in order to manage user logins and other core administrative features. These are considered essential for the operation of this website.

We also use Google Analytics to track visitor data trends and general usage statistics. We do not collect any personal information via these cookies other than your IP address. This information is automatically deleted after 14 months following your last visit to our website. These are non-essential cookies.

The rules about cookies on websites have changed. If you are uncomfortable with the use of cookies, you can disable cookies on your computer by changing the settings in the preferences or options menu in your browser. You can set your browser to reject or block cookies or to tell you when a website tries to put a cookie on your computer. You can also delete any cookies that are already stored on your computer's hard drive. However, please be aware that if you do delete and block all cookies from our website, parts of the site may not work. Likewise, you may not be able to use some products and services on other websites without cookies.
